After Lunch Speaker

Presentation from speaker Mike Holly - Dairy Farm Strategy Distribution in Pennsylvania and Implications to Productivity and Nutrient Management. Michael A. Holly*, Peter J. Kleinmana, C. The documented emergence of alternative dairy production strategies may have implications for environmental losses. This study compared farm strategies and simulated environmental impact of the major dairy farm production strategies in PA (confinement, semi-confinement, organic, Amish farm management, and management intensive rotational grazing) using Agricultural Research Management Survey (ARMS). Average farm sizes and management strategies from survey data were then with the Integrated Farm System Model (IFSM) to simulate whole farm production and environmental impact. Results from the study will be used to identify recommendations for feasible best management practices to decrease environmental implications with negligible impact to profit margins.
