- Grassland Evaluation Contest October 12, 2017
 - Scholarship fun +\$3400 over obligations to scholarship
 - Student eligible till end of august for a total \$1500 next year possible -\$3000 depending on next year's winners
 - \$12,667.74 total Fayette donated \$750, Somerset donated \$300, GLC \$500, SWPG donates \$200/year
 - There was a \$250 scholarship request
 - There is more than enough to cover the next few years but fundraising is still needed
 - Send brochures to Envirothon coordinator, Ginny will be attending the 4-H leaders and Envirothon coordinators meetings this summer
 - We were not selected for the DEP EE grant. We need giveaways for teachers. The Districts can each give a few weed guides to hand out there.

 - Discussion was had over the money that is set aside in the budget for the biannual conference and weather it should be used yearly of save for a larger biannual conference. This conversation was tabled.
- Motion to split mini grant money evenly between Westmoreland County for the Grazing conference and Somerset County for Advanced Grazing School. First Danielle, second Pierce. Motion carried.

Grazing sticks

- Greene County would like to order grazing sticks
- The price per stick goes down as we order more
- The sticks are a little bit more expensive than the last time we ordered them
- 250 sticks \$5, 500 sticks \$4.50, 1000 sticks \$4.35, 2500 \$4.20
- Set up charge \$200 per side, do not charge for the yardstick side would be an additional \$600
- Wooden unfinished stick
- Green County will be ordering at least 100
- Karlie will speak with her board about writing a grant for the grazing stick in exchange for 100 of the grazing stick that we currently have
- West Virginia NRCS will be printing bookmarks to go along with the grazing sticks explaining how to use them at no cost to us. We would like to place the Project Grass logo on them
- Motion to get bookmarks printed to accompany grazing sticks. First Danielle, second Karlie. Motion carried.
- Motion to allow executive board to make a decision on making a deal with Green county and ordering the grazing sticks. First Pierce, second Jessica. Motion carried.
